Climatology is a branch of geography that studies the climate, weather patterns, atmospheric processes, and their interactions with the Earth's surface. It is essential for understanding global and regional climate systems, which impact ecosystems, agriculture, and human settlements.

1. Basics of Climatology

(1) Climate vs. Weather:

- Weather: Short-term atmospheric conditions (hours or days).

(1) Layers of the Atmosphere:

1. Troposphere:

- Closest to Earth (up to ~12 km).
- o Weather phenomena occur here.
- o Temperature decreases with altitude (lapse rate).

2. Stratosphere:

- o Contains the ozone layer (~20-30 km).
- o Temperature increases with altitude due to ozone absorption of UV rays.





















